- An email with work updates has been received by the Chair from Glos Highways
 Richard Gray.
- Sunken drain covers between Oxford Cottages and Seven Springs: RG to ensure
 drain at Oxford Cottage is free of blockages but as it discharges into the stream,
 dissipation of surface water will be dependent on level of water in stream. Gullies
 nearer to Seven Springs to be rebuilt as and when resources permit and
 recessed into verge to avoid vehicle wheel line.

Duncan McGaw (Chair) declared an interest as resident of Salterley Grange in the following item:

- It was noted by the Parish Council that there are 24 residences in Salterley Grange, served by a private driveway, which is sited on a very dangerous part of a main road into Cheltenham but there are no warning signs of a turning. GCC has suggested that signage would have to be funded by residents as it is not in their remit to sign private drives. However, Cllr Paul Hodgkinson advised that there may be some Councillors' funding available and residents should make contact with him to discuss further.
- Sign cleaning on all roads has been raised with Glos Highways.
- Overgrown vegetation was a problem last summer and continued to be reported this year. It has now been severely cut back on major roads to ease the problem.
- Air Balloon Highways England has 4 years until 2020 to consult on this project, design the solution and apply for a Development Control Order. If they are then given the go-ahead by Government, work would then take place between sometime 2020 -2026. Cllr Paul Hodgkinson will keep the Parish Council updated on any further information.
- Pot Holes continue to be a problem and the need to report these was reiterated to all. Paul to take up the section of carriageway between Air Balloon and Ullenwood Court with Highways. There have been severe potholes in the past and although repaired, they soon re-open. Considered that the section needs more substantial patching. It was reported that on the last occasion of a deep pothole, so many vehicles were suffering damaged wheels that an AA van remained stationed in the area.

9 Queen's 90th Birthday Celebration Beacons

There was discussion whether to look for a celebration in June rather than April but as the national event is 21 April, it was agreed to contact residents to gauge interest and to ask Dan Powell to confirm whether he has a suitable location for a beacon. 10 Risk Assessment

Parish Councillors have reviewed the amendments made to this document and minor changes were made – to be signed at next meeting. It was agreed to review this annually or twice a year if changes are made.

12 Neighbourhood Plan

Discussion took place following the meeting with Evans Jones. It was agreed that this is a huge undertaking but the Parish Council feels it is important to have a document in place. Cllr Nick Parsons advised that Regulation 19 of the Local Plan would be published for consultation in April and it was agreed to wait until that is published before continuing, in order to review or refine our requirements for a Neighbourhood Plan and determine the cost-effectiveness of proceeding. It was also agreed to get the parish of Coberley designated as a Neighbourhood Area, with a parish boundary map from CDC.(see item 4 bullet point 3 above). It was agreed to ask Joseph Walker at CDC for an indication of costs which have been incurred by other parishes in this process such as
